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## 1. Background

- 1. Tokyo Gakugei University (TGU), as a top-runner for the teacher education university with its historical facts, is considered its mission to pursue and achieve its mission after going corporate in April 2004.
- 2. In April 2006, TGU started the four-year JICA Project 'Improvement of Teaching Methods to Promote the Mongolian Children Development' with Mongolian State University of Education (MSUE) and National University of Mongolia (NUM), which aims at realizing 'Learner-centered Approach to Learning' especially in such subject matters and areas as school mathematics, school science, IT education and integrated learning in primary and secondary education levels, and is based on 'The Four Pillars of Education' described in 'Learning: Treasure Within' published by UNESCO in 1996.
- 3. In August 2007, in collaboration with NHK Japan Prize Secretariat, the Japan Prize Library for Nomad Central Asia in Mongolia is established at IT Center in MSUE, aiming at the promotion of the utilization and research on educational TV programmes in schools, TV stations and its related institutions.
- 4. In October 2007, three universities, TGU, MSUE and NUM, have arrived at general agreements 'International Academic Exchange Activities' to strengthen their capabilities and to promote teacher education through several modalities.
- 5. In November 2007, Mongolia joined in the Committee on the International Contest for Multimedia Material Utilization to send a representative and a top winner at its National Contest to the Third International Contest for Multimedia Material Utilization held in Shanghai, P. R. China.
